



Roberto Ranieri has graduated in Agricultural Sciences. In the early 90s he worked as Associate Scientist at CIMMYT, Mexico. In 1993 he received a Master of Science at the Purdue University, West Lafayette, IN, USA. In 1993, he joined Barilla and began working as manager in the R&D department. For Barilla he organized strategic research projects that led to the release of four high-quality varieties of durum wheat and eight European patents. He has been responsible for a number of major research projects funded at national and European level. In 2005, he was appointed director of CORIAL (Food Research Consortium of Barilla in Foggia). From 1998 to 2010, he was an advisor of Italmopa (Association of Italian millers), and from 2005 to 2010 board member of the European research project HEALTHGRAIN. In 2010 he founded Open Fields Ltd., of which he is Managing Director. Since 2014 he is member of the Italian National Academy of Agriculture.
